



25 Christian Colleges Students Want to Attend!

Getting into colleges is quite a process. Students rightly view it as they are competing to gain acceptance from the college. But, colleges are also competing for the students. Students are often admitted to several colleges but can only choose one. The percentage of students who enroll after being accepted is called the Yield. This is a helpful number that can be useful in assessing a school's perceived desirability to students and parents and is one factor in the Faith on View Christian College Rankings. The numbers for this report come from the US News Rankings and the National Center for Education Statistics. It is important to realize that not all institutions in the Faith on View rankings were included in this US News study or have statistics available with the National Center for Education Statistics.
